Match Committee

- Members are requested to take notice of the information on the notice boards and be conversant with such information before play.
- The Match Committee has sole jurisdiction on all competitions associated with this Club.
- The Match Committees of the Club shall have full power to adjust handicaps strictly in accordance with the current system of handicapping as instructed by Golf Victoria and Golf Australia.

- The lowest marker of any group is the Captain of that group and is responsible for the observance of etiquette during play.
- The Rules and Etiquette of golf must be strictly observed.
- Players just ensure that any damage to greens or fairways is repaired promptly – ESPECIALLY DIVOTS AND PLUG MARKS.
- All matches in Knock-out Competitions must return a card; this includes members who are forced to NCR for reasons beyond their control.
- Any protest arising from a Club Competition must be lodged with a member of the Match Committee, in writing, on the day of the competition in question, and before trophy presentations. Such protests must be signed by the member making the protest, and must state the grounds upon which it is made.
- Where a time-sheet is applicable to any club competition, members shall be required to report to the starter 15 minutes prior to their 'hit off' time. Failure to do so, without excuse, or prior notification to the starter, may result in the player being sent to the rear of the field, as well as loss of the right to place their name on the time-sheet for the following week.

Pennant Rules - Men

All men are encouraged to try out for the Pennant teams to represent our Club in the South Gippsland Golf Inc Pennant season. A Pennant Meeting is usually called in February – March where practice and rules will be set out.

Members representing the Club in Pennant shall be bound by a strict code of behaviour, dress, course etiquette and demeanour. Members attending practice sessions and pennant meetings will have selection preference. The Pennant Match Committee consists of the Captain of each Division.

Dress Regulations - Men

All men playing golf at the Wonthaggi Golf Club are asked to dress according to the Club's dress code.

The following items of attire are not acceptable:

- Singlets and football or bicycle type shorts, tracksuits
- Thongs, bare feet or work boots

When wearing acceptable shorts, men may wear sports socks only.

Only Polo and approved golf shirts are to be worn.

Dress Regulations - Ladies

All ladies playing golf at the Wonthaggi Golf Club are asked to dress according to the Club's dress code.

The following items of attire are not acceptable:

- Ladies singlet tops
- Ladies shorts above mid-thigh.

The following is a guide to what complies with the Club Dress Code and is acceptable:

- Over shirts may be worn over shorts and slacks at member's own discretion.
- Only Golf Shoes are to be worn on the course at all times.
- On Competition days, the Committee prefers that tracksuits and leggings not be worn in the Clubhouse after completing your round of golf.
- On Special Days (South Gippsland events or any events open to visitors to our Club), no leggings or tracksuits are to be worn on the course or in the Clubhouse.

General

No member shall post or cause to have posted, any notice in the Clubhouse or on the Club grounds, without the approval of the General Committee.

Members shall be bound by the Club rules as set down by the General Committee. Any member failing to obey the rules of the Club may be called upon to give an explanation of their actions to the General, Match or Disciplinary Committee.

All visitors to our Club must be signed in.

Golf Etiquette

Courtesy on the Course: In the interest and consideration of all, players should play without delay. No player should play until the players in front are out of range.

Players searching for a ball should signal the players behind them to pass as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not easily be found. They should not continue to play until those players have passed and are out of range.

Behaviour during Play: No one should move, talk, or stand close to or directly behind the ball or hole, when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke. The player who has the honour should be allowed to play before his/her opponent or before their fellow competitor tees his/her ball, and then mark down their score after he/she has hit their drive.

Priority on Course: In the absence of special rules, two ball matches should have precedence and be entitled to pass any three or four ball match. A single player has no standing and should give way to a match of any kind.

Care of the Course: All players should carefully smooth over all holes and footprints left in sand bunkers. Through the green, a player should ensure that any turf cut or displaced by him/her is replaced at once and pressed down, and that any damage to the putting green caused by plug marks or golf shoe spikes, should be repaired on the completion of the hole.

Please, when marking a nearest the pin or pro-pin, it is highly recommended not to gouge or scratch your mark into the putting surface.

Players should ensure that, when putting down bags or the flag stick, no damage is done to the putting green, and that neither they nor their caddies, damage the hole by standing close to it, handling the flagstick, or in removing the ball from the hole.

The flagstick should be properly replaced in the hole before the players leave the putting green. Players should not damage the putting green

by leaning on their putter, particularly when removing the ball from the hole. Local rules regulating the movement of golf carts should be strictly observed.

In taking practice swings, players should not cause any damage to course and tees by removing divots. If you as a member see any damage being undertaken by anyone, please report it immediately to a member of the Match Committee, a ground staff worker or a Committee member.

Golf Carts: No motorised golf carts are allowed within 7 metres of any green or tees. Where possible, it is recommended to drive golf carts on the edges of the fairways and not on the fairways. Buggies are not allowed on any tees. Golf carts are taken onto the Wonthaggi Golf Club property at the owner/driver's own risk, and the Wonthaggi Golf Club Inc will not be held responsible for any accident, injury or damage that may be caused.

Speed of Play: Players should always walk quickly between shots, and should always remember that when they are out of handicap shots in Par/Stableford events, the ball should be picked up.

Players should not engage in idle chatter on tees during play, and the player with the honour should mark their card after they have hit their tee shot. Holes should be played within a 10-12 minute period.

Any match playing a whole round is entitled to pass a match playing a shorter round.

If a match fails to keep his/her place in the course and loses more than one clear hole on the players in front, it must allow any faster match following to pass. Where a faster match is held up by a match barely holding its place within one clear hole in the field, it should allow the faster match/group to pass.

Basically, this means.... Can you see the group in front... No... can you see the group behind you... Yes ... Is that group waiting for you continuously... Yes... then call that group through.

Men's Single Championships

OPEN EVENT : A Minor (8-12) : B Grade (13-18) :
C Grade (19-25) : D Grade : (26-36)

Qualifying rounds will be played over 36 holes stroke play over two days. All OPEN EVENT qualifiers must be available for a playoff as required.

Grades: A minor, B, C & D that result in a tie, will be decided via countback.

The leading qualifier will win the K. Hollole Trophy whilst the top 4 scratch scores in each Grade will qualify for match-play eliminations as follows:

Semi-Finals

1st Qualifier vs 4th Qualifier

2nd Qualifier vs 3rd Qualifier

Final

Winners of the above matches contest against each other.

Semi-Finals and Finals will consist of 36 holes Match Play for OPEN and A Minor, whilst B, C and D Grades will play over 18 holes Match Play. Hit off times are detailed in the Fixture.

Seniors Championships

All entrants aged 55 and over will also qualify for the Seniors Championships played over the first two rounds of the Championships, and played for the best Net Score.

Junior Championships

All junior entrants will also qualify for the Junior Championships played over the first 2 rounds of the Championships and played for the best Scratch and Net Scores.

Presentations

Presentations for all Championships will be held in the Clubhouse after the Singles Finals. All members are encouraged to attend not only Presentations, but also the Finals being played that day as a spectator.

Distance Markers

On the Wonthaggi Golf Club Course, yellow markers / poles have been placed alongside the Fairway on all Par 4's and Par 5's, 150 metres from the centre of the Green.

Australian Countback System

A Tie in events shall be decided whenever possible by replay, but if the Committee considers this to be inexpedient, the following count-back method shall be used:

1. For 18 hole events, the best score for the last nine holes shall be used; if there is still a Tie, the last 6 holes, then if there is still a Tie, the last 3 holes. If a Tie still persists, then hole by hole from the 18th back.
2. In 27, 36, 54, and 72 hole events, the last 18 holes shall be used and if still Tied, countback as in 1 above.
3. In Handicap events the relevant handicap OR FRACTION THEREOF shall be applied.
4. In 9 Hole events the last 6 holes shall be used, if there is still a Tie, the last 3 holes, then hole by hole from the 9th back.

NOTE: In all cases the last holes are as per the score card and not necessarily as played.

Golf Competitions

'How they are Played'

These notes are only intended to assist in the general concept of how various competitions are played. They must be read in conjunction with the rules of golf and in particular, with any conditions the Match Committee may lay down. (See Rules 29, 31, 32 and 33)

Stroke

The score at each hole is entered on the Scorecard, totalled, and the player's handicap deducted. The player who completes the stipulated round in the fewest strokes, will be the winner.

Par

The stroke score is entered on the card, unless the score exceeds Par after allowing for any Handicap strokes. The Par result is marked in the column provided with a '+' Plus sign for a Win (ie. Net Birdie or better), an '0' for a half (ie Net Par), or a '-' Minus sign for a Loss (ie Net Bogie).

The ball is usually picked up after being beaten by Par to speed up general play. At the end of the round, the Plus and Minus signs are added and the result is written in as 'All Square' or as many 'Up' or 'Down'. For example, a player who has one handicap stroke on a Par 4, would win (+) the hole with a 4 or better, half (0) the hole with a 5, and lose (-) the hole with a 6.

A player's handicap strokes are taken at holes as indicated on the Par/Stableford Index on the scorecard. Where a player is on a 19 Handicap or more, two strokes are taken on holes in the same order.

Stableford

The player takes strokes on the holes in the same order as in Par, and scores points for the results on each hole. At the end of the round, the points are added up and the player with the highest number of points is the winner.

In scoring STABLEFORD, after allowing for handicap strokes, a player scores 1 point for a Net Bogie, 2 points for a Net Par, 3 points for a Net Birdie, 4 points for a Net Eagle and so on.... For example, a player who has a handicap stroke on a Par 4, would score Nil for a 7, 1 point for a 6, 2 points for a 5, 3 points for a 4, 4 points for a 3, and so on....

Bisque Par

A variation on the Par event, is where players can allocate their full handicap however they wish, by deciding how many handicap strokes to take at each hole immediately after playing the hole, and before teeing off at the next hole.

Players cannot be handicapped when playing Bisque Par.

Irish Stableford

Play with a partner and the 2 X Stableford scores are 'multiplied' by each other at each hole.

For example, Partner A scores 3 points and Partner B scores 2 points = the Team Score is 6 points. If Partner A had a score of 3 points and Partner B had a score of 0, then the Team Score is zero.

Ambrose

HANDICAPS: After calculations are made ($1/8^{\text{th}}$ of the total in a 4 ball and $1/4$ of the total in a 2 ball).

TEE SHOTS: Each player must use at least 6 of their Tee Shots in a 2 ball and 3 Tee Shots in a 4 ball. The scorer must record on each hole whose Tee Shot is used.

ON THE FAIRWAY: Place a marker within one club length of the chosen ball. Such ball is to be played as it lies, other balls may be placed as near as possible to the position from which the ball was marked (no nearer the hole), any order of play.

OFF THE FAIRWAY: Same procedure as above except, balls other than the chosen ball shall be dropped in the same conditions (no nearer the hole). That is, hazard, rough, bunker.

ON THE PUTTING GREEN: The chosen ball must be marked. Other balls are to be putted within one putter head length, either side of the chosen ball (no nearer the hole). Any order of play. To encourage speed of play tap in putts are allowed.

Flag Competitions

Played as a stroke round, when the first player has reached a number of strokes equal to the Par of the course, plus his/her stroke handicap, he/she plants the flag (provided) at the spot where the ball lays at the end of his/her round. If the ball is in the rough, the flag may be planted next to the Fairway, not nearer the hole. If subsequent players have not finished their allotted strokes upon reaching the flag, they carry it with them until they exhaust their strokes. The winner is the player to carry the flag the longest distance, normally this is beyond the 18th hole, usually on the 1st or 2nd hole. The competition can be played in two or more divisions using more than one flag. This event can be in conjunction with a normal stroke round.

4 BBB or Stableford

Two players play as partners, each taking handicap strokes as per the index in a normal Par or Stableford round. Only the best result at each hole is written down on the card. That is, if Partner A has a win and Partner B has a half then Player A's stroke score is written in Column A, and a (+) is recorded in the column provided. Where both players score the same result, the score of the player first in the hole is used, unless there is a scratch event when the player with the lowest stroke score is used.

Where a team scores 6 up (in Par) or 42 points (in Stableford), any player having their name on the card nine or more times, shall be re-handicapped if their adjusted score exceeds the CCR of the competition. The adjusted score is a stroke score compiled using a complicated formula, which invariably results in favour of a higher stroke score than the player actually would have had over 18 holes.

Scoring of your Scorecard

It is the player's responsibility to make sure his or her scorecard is completed correctly prior to handing it in to the Handicapper and event organisers. The card must have - the player's name, current handicap, date of the event, scratch score for each individual hole, and the player's and marker's signatures.

Foursomes

Two players play as partners and use one ball. They strike alternatively from the tee and thereafter strike the ball alternatively during the play at each hole. For example, Partner A hits off the 1st tee and then Player B hits the second shot. Player A hits the 3rd shot, Player B hits the 4th shot, and so on until the hole is complete. Player B then hits off the 2nd tee and players then alternate until the ball is holed. Partner A then hits off the 3rd tee etc. Penalty strokes do not alter the rotation of play. Scoring is for a stroke round and the total is subject to a deduction of ½ the partners' aggregate handicaps. In Mixed Foursomes, the Committee should lay down a condition of play whether the male or female is to play from the 1st tee.

Canadian Foursomes

Played as per 'Foursomes', except that both players play tee shots at each hole, the best ball is nominated and alternate shots are played until the ball is holed. Scoring is as for a stroke round and the total is subject a deduction of $\frac{3}{8}$ th the partners' aggregate handicaps.

American Foursomes

Both players play tee shots at each hole, then play a second stroke with their partner's ball. One ball is then selected and play proceeds as in Foursomes with the owner of the ball selected playing the 3rd stroke.

Scoring is as for a stroke round and the total is subject to a deduction of $\frac{3}{8}$ th of the partners' aggregate handicaps for Mixed and Ladies events and $\frac{1}{2}$ for Men's events.

Chapman Foursomes

Both players play tee shots at each hole, and then play a second shot with their own ball. One ball is then selected and play proceeds as in Foursomes with the partner taking the next stroke. Scoring is for a stroke round and the total is subject to a deduction of $\frac{1}{2}$ partners' aggregate handicaps for Men's events and $\frac{3}{8}$ th aggregate handicaps for Mixed and Ladies events.

Match Play

Played by holes rather than the total number of strokes. The player who holes his/her ball in the least amount of strokes wins a hole. A hole is halved if both players complete the hole in the same score. The match is won by the player who is leading by a number of holes greater than the number of holes remaining. In a Handicap match, the lower handicap player gives the higher handicap player a number of strokes equal to the difference in their handicaps. The strokes are taken at the holes as per the 'Match Index' (not the Par/Stableford Index) on the scorecard, and the lower Net Score wins the hole.
